

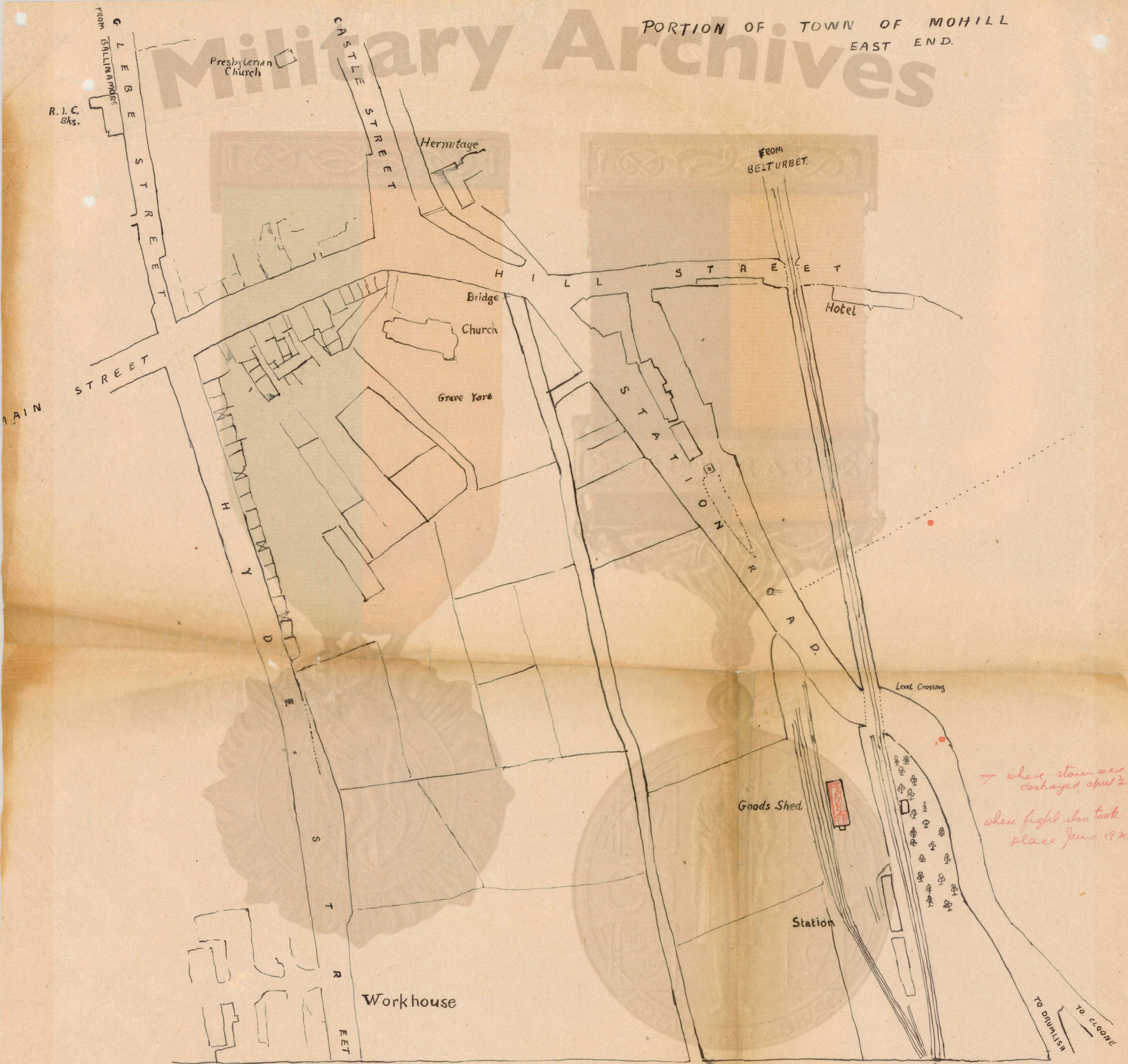

REMARKS.	<p>Destruction of military goods at Mohill Station. A raid was ordered by Brigadier Mitchel on the Railway Station at Mohill. The station was guarded by 2 R.I.C. 7 Volunteers lay in wait and when the R.I.C. moved off to a distance of 100 yards or so, fire was opened on the R.I.C. 3 Volunteers got a quantity of goods consigned to military, mattresses, bedding and motor tyres. Sprinkled the goods with petrol and oil and set fire to them. The Volunteers got away safely.</p>
