

## 1916 SURVIVORS' MEDAL

### **YEAR OF CREATION:**

1966

### **PURPOSE OF MEDAL:**

Commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the Rising of Easter Week, 1916.

### **CONDITIONS OF ISSUE:**

Recognised military service during Easter Week 1916. The Medal was awarded to surviving participants only.

### **DESIGN:**

A silver gilt circular medal approximately 38 millimetres in diameter bearing on the obverse a reproduction of the Cúchulainn statue which stands in the G.P.O., Dublin. The reverse bears the inscription "1916 CÁISC 1966". Cáisc is translated "EASTER".

### **RIBBON:**

Green with orange borders and a narrow white stripe down the centre.

### **SUSPENSION BAR:**

The suspension bar from which the ribbon is suspended bears a Celtic interlaced design.
