SECTION 14 OF THE MILITARY SERVICE PENSIONS ACT, 1934.

(1) Where—

- (a) a certificate of military service or a service certificate has been issued to any person, and
- (b) the Minister is required by the immediately preceding Section to revoke or amend such certificate,

the Minister shall send by registered post, addressed to such person at his last known residence, a notice requiring such person to send such certificate to the Minister within such time after the service of such notice as may be specified in such notice.

- (2) If any person upon whom a notice under this Section has been served fails to comply with such notice, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this Section, and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and a further fine not exceeding one pound for every day during which such offence is continued.

Being convinced that my claim to a pension was not, at any stage, determined by your Board, in accordance with the actual terms of the military Service Pensions Act, I now make a further appeal, through you, to the Referee, and I request him to investigate and interrogate additional verifying officers in support of my claim, to a longer term award. Briefly, here are the facts.

I was awarded — like other members who were fully qualified — the full award for Easter week, 1916. although my services and risks were continuously greater from 1916 to 1922, unceasing; I have been allowed only 6 months of a qualifying period — that is I am allowed 4½ years in all.

Now, here is the position — to my certain knowledge several of our members have been awarded twice and some three times the amount of my award.

The testimony of the officers already submitted to your Board ought to be believed, and if they are sufficiently satisfactory in the case

11/ of other members to admit of full time awards on what grounds were my services valued at only six months in ten years? I feel that an injustice has been done to me - involuntarily perhaps - nevertheless it is there.

If the Referee would call additional verifying officers, who are still available, I feel quite confident that my award would not be six months from Easter week 1916 to 1922 but the entire period.

May I add that a rumour - or statement - has reached me to the effect that because I was given an award under other circumstances that my claim for a Service Pension was cut accordingly.

May I point out that there is nothing in the act to allow of such action by the officials in your office. I stand on my merits as an officer of rank in Germany and I challenge any person to refute the fact that my claim is genuine.

I therefore demand, with all deference to your Committee, that the Referee shall re-open my case and examine my claim and my award in comparison with those of other members of our organisation. I only ask for justice and am confident that after the recent press reports the Referee will see that it is granted to me.


